3.	Director's Report	
•	2014 Glass Initiative Grant Update	The District was able to have three containers for glass only recycling constructed at no cost to the District with grant funds from OEPA. They were deployed out at the National Regatta at Harsha Lake and are now at the Adams County drop-off locations. The grant was closed out and all the funds were spent.
•	2015 Tire Amnesty Grant	The District will be holding two-tire amnesty day events, one at Adams Waste and Recycling and one in Felicity at Franklin Township. The District pays \$2.50/car tire and \$25-35/tractor tires for recycling. We

Activities advertise that we don't accept tires from businesses, but since the grant goal is to clean-up legal piles, we typically don't turn people away. There are concerns that residents may be piling up to expectation of free-Tire Amnesty Days in lieu of paying the state fee and disposing of them when new tires. Mr. Braasch has been lobbying for more sustainable tire management strategy. Mr. Braasch mentioned that the District may start seeing bills for household hazardous wasted from Environmental Enterprises for about \$5,000. The company historically has neglected to see District bills for this service.
